RE-IMAGINING THE ROLE OF THE HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARIAN IN THE NEW INFORMATION ECONOMY: AN INFORMATICIST'S PERSPECTIVE

Philip J. Kroth, MD, MS, joined HSLIC in 2004 as the Assistant Director of Health Sciences Informatics Program Development and as an Assistant Professor in the School of Medicine. He holds a joint appointment in the Division of General Internal Medicine and is a practicing, board certified Internist. He is also the Biomedical Informatics Director for UNM's new Clinical and Translational Sciences Center.

Dr. Kroth earned a Masters in clinical research and completed a 3-year, National Library of Medicine sponsored research fellowship in biomedical informatics, both at the Regenstrief Institute at Indiana University. He earned his BS in Computer Engineering from the Rochester Institute of Technology and worked for 4 years in that capacity for Eastman Kodak Company in Rochester, NY before attending medical school at the Medical College of Ohio in Toledo.

Dr. Kroth has performed research on the effectiveness of computerized decision support and recent research also has focused on issues related to open access publishing. At HSLIC, Dr. Kroth is responsible for the development of the UNM Biomedical Informatics Training Program which is one of only a few in the country that are organizationally housed inside a health sciences library. This has provided Dr. Kroth with a very unique perspective on medicine and research from inside the "librarians' world" as well as a view of the state of the health sciences librarian profession from the "outside" perspective of physician and biomedical informatician.

THE MAGNET RECOGNITION AWARD: THE JOURNEY TO NURSING AND INSTITUTIONAL EXCELLENCE

K. Ann Caudell joined University of New Mexico Hospitals in September, 2006 as the Project Consultant for the Magnet Recognition Award. She was a faculty member at the College of Nursing (CoN) and obtained tenure in 1999. During her employment at the CoN, she developed a Master's track in Oncology Nursing and assisted with the development of a series of courses entitled Human Responses to Health and Illness. Prior to her current position, she was the Associate Director of the Southwest Region Oncology Medical Liaisons for Amgen, Inc. where she worked for seven years.

Dr. Caudell received her PhD in Nursing from the University of Washington in 1993 and a Master's Degree in Oncology Nursing from UCLA in 1987. Her dissertation research focused on the psychophysiological responses of women exposed to an acute stressor. She has also evaluated the effects of submersion in a virtual reality environment on mood state, simulator sickness, galvanic skin response, blood pressure and pulse rate.

Working as the Project Consultant for the Magnet Recognition Award affords her the opportunity to interact with leadership and point-of-care staff throughout UNMH. She submitted the first Nursing Division Annual Report in January, 2007; is the Editor of the first *Nursing Newsletter*, and is currently leading an initiative to identify and implement a nursing care delivery model for the hospital.

R. PHILIP EATON, M.D.
Emeritus Executive Vice President for Health Sciences
University of New Mexico

CREATIVE THINKING: CONNECTING SERVICE, TEACHING & DISCOVERY

R. Philip Eaton, MD, served as Executive Vice President for Health Sciences at the University of New Mexico (UNM), 1998 to 2005. Eaton joined UNM in 1968 and has been Chief of the Division of Endocrinology and Metabolism, Associate Dean for Research in the School of Medicine and Director of the Clinical Research Center. He is Professor of Medicine and Professor of Mathematics and Statistics.

Eaton is a member of numerous professional societies, a fellow in the American College of Physicians, has authored more than 200 articles, book chapters, and books, and served as an editor for 14 journals. He is a nationally recognized researcher in endocrinology, with particular interest in diabetes. His prolific career includes a collaboration with Sandia National Labs, which led to the invention and patent of the first implantable, programmable insulin pump and ongoing development of the glucose sensor. Eaton's breakthrough research has significantly improved the care and treatment of people with diabetes. Upon retirement from the Health Sciences Center, the UNM Board of Regents established the Phil and Olga Eaton Sculpture Garden of Healing. The Garden is designed to visually represent the connection between the creativity of teaching, healing, and discovery. While visiting Albuquerque, consider touring the new Domenici Center for Health Sciences Education and exploring the emergent Garden of Healing.

Eaton's presentation at General Session 3 suggests that through a creative process we can re-imagine our experiences as librarians so that we connect our service, to teaching and discovery. Dr. Eaton's creative thinking will help us to recognize the creative thinking that is within each of us as professionals.
