DEVELOPING RELATIONSHIPS AND EXPANDING COMMUNICATIONS

GENERAL PROGRAM GOALS

- To create a formal avenue for the exchange of information between Health Sciences Center (HSC) departments and the Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center (HSLIC)
- To identify knowledge management needs for access and use of information and technology resources
- To assure that HSLIC collections and technology resources effectively support education, research, patient care and administrative services for the HSC
- To promote awareness of HSLIC resources, services, and educational opportunities and how these can support education, research, patient care and administrative services

LIAISON ACTIVITIES

- Meet with the department or chair to learn about current plans for the department and identify contact person to work with liaison
- Learn about the curricular and research efforts in the department
- Distribute information targeted to the liaison department to highlight HSLIC services, collection resources and development
- Review departmental recommendations for the collection and order as appropriate

- Orient new departmental faculty to services
- Assist with department, self-study, accreditation, re-accreditation, or grants
- Provide consultation on information curricular needs and schedule workshops on relevant electronic products
- Inform faculty regarding significant changes in access to services
