


## Importing References From TOXLINE into RefWorks

- 1) While in TOXLINE, click on checkbox to select the citations you wish to download.
- 2) Before moving on to the next page of citations, click Save Checked items button.



- 3) When finished browsing citations, click Display Saved Items button. Sort them if you wish.
- 4) Click on download button.
- 5) Select Tagged format and click Download. Go to File/Save As and save the file as a .txt file.

- 6) Go into RefWorks and at the top of the screen select **Import** from the **References** pull down menu.
- 7) In the Import Filter/DataSource box, select **TOXNET** Import Filter.
- 8) In the Database box, select Toxline (tagged).
- 9) In the Import References Into box, select the folder in your RefWorks database that you want to put your references into (or, first create a folder for this purpose).

10) In the Import Data from the Following Text File box, click on the Browse button to the right and select your file that you saved from TOXLINE.

11) Finally, click on the Import button.
