Research, Teaching and Service Interests:

Research:

For the past 15 years I have had a keen interest in advancing applied research in librarianship. This process has included utilizing the most appropriate and rigorous research methodologies to answer the questions my discipline has identified as most important. In librarianship we refer to this approach to using the best available research results for decision-making as either Evidence-Based Librarianship (EBL) or sometimes as Evidence-Based Librarianship & Information Practice.

An outgrowth of my interest has been the adaptation of evidence-based practice research designs, such as the cohort study or the randomized controlled trial, to answer important questions in librarianship. The cohort design has been used in librarianship during the past 50 years, but applied only narrowly within my past specialty of collection development and my present specialty of library education. The randomized controlled trial methodology has been used hardly at all within librarianship. Two articles of mine published during 2002 and 2003 were direct attempts to expand the utilization of these two evidence-based research designs in librarianship.

During the 2000-2002 period I attempted to correct for these deficiencies in the field by serving as the principal investigator in three randomized controlled trials. Two of these studies won an Award and an Honorable Mention in the Medical Library Association Research Award competition. The third study won a Research Award from the South Central Chapter of the Medical Library Association. Two of these studies involved my mentoring two junior faculty colleagues, Charity Karcher and Ingrid Hendrix, who had never before conducted original research studies.

Teaching:

My teaching has occurred in a variety of formats since 1978, although I have always emphasized an experiential learning approach. I began my career in library instruction, building upon the foundation established with my three mentors during my internship at the University of Michigan. Eventually my career path took me into collection development in 1985, but I continued to teach library and informatics skills regularly, particularly during the 1986-1993 period. During the years 1997-2001 I was an active tutor for several instructional “blocks” in the UNM School of Medicine, as summarized elsewhere in this document. During January 2001, I was promoted to a newly created position as Coordinator of Academic and Clinical Services, which has allowed me to teach even more than in the past primarily as a library and informatics skills trainer. During 2002, for example, I taught 314 total contact hours.

Service:

My association work for the Medical Library Association and its South Central Chapter has focused upon creating opportunities for the pursuit of relevant research in my field and the integration of appropriate research into professional practice. To this end I have served two terms in office as the elected Chair of the Medical Library Association’s Research Section. Regionally, I have served on the Research Committee of the South Central Chapter of the Medical Library Association since 1997 as both a member and as Chair. I have served as the Journal Review Editor for *JAMA* and on the editorial boards of *Biomedical Libraries Acquisitions Bulletin* and *Hypothesis*. I have had a related interest in improving editorial peer review practices manifested in my research grant on the subject, publications, and association with peer-reviewed journals.
