Personal Research, Teaching and Service Interests

Research, teaching and service interests are integral to the development of a “collaboratory” for health sciences center libraries. As part of my recruitment to UNM I presented the concept and my personal philosophy for building a strong library. This philosophy drives my management style and areas of research interests.

To build a collaboratory, an environment must be created for information resources that build on collaboration with campus units (as well as organizations outside the organization) to develop a laboratory environment for creating, exploring, and using information resources and technology. The collaboratory must focus on informatics, instructional technology, information literacy, and knowledge management.
