The College of Pharmacy at the University of New Mexico, founded in 1945, was the first health professional program on the University of New Mexico campus and is the only pharmacy school in the state of New Mexico.

▪ MISSION

▪ EDUCATION

Since 1996, The College of Pharmacy has exclusively offered the four-year professional Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D) degree program which enrolls approximately 85 students annually. Over 150 community pharmacies, hospitals, nursing homes, community health clinics, and government agencies serve as practice sites for our students as part of our experiential education program. ▪ RESEARCH

Faculty are engaged in a wide variety of research endeavors in the areas of basic pharmaceutical sciences and toxicology, pharmacy practice, poison control and drug information, and radiopharmacy. College of Pharmacy faculty are also involved in various interdisciplinary, multi-investigator research programs within the UNM Health Sciences Center (HSC). The goals and objectives of our research are consistent with our location within the University of New Mexico HSC, the major Carnegie Mellon Research Tier I University in the State of New Mexico.

- ◆ The College administers the New Mexico Poison and Drug Information Center, a 24 hour/365 day provider of poison and drug information to all citizens of New Mexico
- ◆ The College publishes continuing education lessons for nuclear pharmacists and nuclear medicine professionals five-six times per year and is accredited by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education.
- ◆ The College has a long history of collaboration with the Veterans Affairs Cooperative Studies Program Clinical Research Pharmacy (VACSPCRP), located in Albuquerque. Professional and graduate students utilize the VACSPCRP as an educational site. A tenured faculty member of the College also serves as chief of the Biopharmaceutics/Pharmacokinetics Laboratory, which provides quality assurance testing of the drugs dispensed by the VACSPCRP.

The College, in conjunction with the UNM HSC and Lovelace Respiratory Research Institute, directs a participant in the New Mexico Center for Environmental Health Sciences, a National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS) funded center. College of Pharmacy Associate Dean of Research, Dr. Scott Burchiel, is the Center's director. With a membership of over 70 scientists and physicians from various disciplines, the Center's mission is to perform basic and translational research that addresses the overall needs of Southwestern communities pertaining to regionally relevant environmental public health issues. The Center is one of only 22 NIEHS funded Environmental Health Centers in the United States.

- PRACTICE Almost all of the College's practitioner faculty maintain patient care practices in UNM HSC hospitals and clinics. The practitioner faculty members have utilized there sites extensively as part of their research programs.

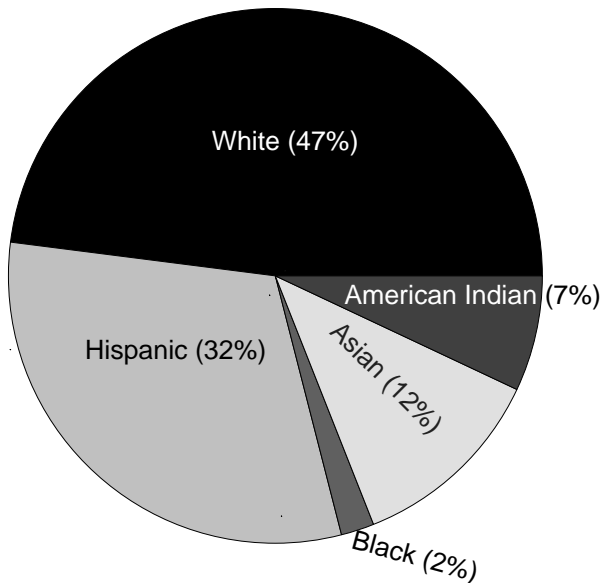

- STUDENT ENROLLMENT The College enrolls 80-85 students per class. Applications for the program are increasing significantly and admission to the program is highly competitive. The College has one of the most diverse student populations among U.S. pharmacy programs, as evidenced by enrolling the second greatest percentage of Native American and second greatest percentage of Hispanic pharmacy student in the country. Student participation in professional organizations has increased dramatically in the last few years and many of our graduating students pursue training at the most prestigious residency programs in the United States.
