National Infant Immunization Week 2008 events

pril was a busy month for the New Mexico
Immunization Coalition. In addition to the last
week of April being National Infant Immunization

Week, Governor Richardson proclaimed the month of

April to be Childhood Awareness Month in New Mexico. Raising awareness about the importance of immunizations, honoring providers who are achieving high immunization rates, participating in the Caravan for Health kickoff activities and coordinating the statewide Got Shots Protect Tots clinics were the main activities this past month Here's a summary of the events:

Provider Awards Dinner

On April 18, A festive dinner ceremony at the Albuquerque Hilton honored 60 providers and individuals for doing an excellent job of getting children immunized. (See page 3 for listing of award

winners.) Fifty providers had immunization rates of 90% or above. In addition, one provider in each Public Health Region was awarded for having the most improved immunization rate, and hospitals in each of the Public Health Regions were honored for excellent coverage of the Hepatitis B birth dose. The awardees were given a certificate signed by the NMIC honorary chair, First Lady Barbara Richardson, and the two co-chairs, Margy Wienbar and Norm White.

The last category of awards was our Immunization Champion awards, given to individuals or groups who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to

educate about, advocate for, or innovate on behalf of immunizations. Our Champions this year were Sidney Kistin, contract nurse for Vecinos y Vacunas, Andrea Larez, nurse for Department of Health, Region IV, Bobby Romero, coordinator and driver for the Blue Cross Blue Shield Van, and the New Mexico Pharmaceutical Association.

The Immunization Champions each received a slate engraved plaque.

both attended to honor the awardees. Our keynote speaker was Robert Filipczak from Bethel, Alaska who presented on some of the innovative ideas his Coalition uses to improve immunization rates. For photos from the Awards Dinner, see our photo gallery.

PAHO Caravan for Health Kickoff Events

The first day of National Infant Immunization Week (NIIW) and Vaccine Week in the Americas, New Mexico participated in a daylong Caravan for Health. Dignitaries from the CDC, the Pan American Health Organization, the US Dept. of Health and Human Services, the Mexican government Health agency, the NM Dept. of Health and the Texas Dept. of Health gathered in Sunland Park for the first event.

La Clinica de Familia hosted the Sunland Park event, providing an opportunity for high level dignitaries to recommit to keeping all children along the border safe from vaccine-preventable diseases. After a tour of the clinic and comments by the dignitaries, a symbolic torch was passed from the NM representative, Jane Peacock, Deputy Director of the Public Health Division to the TX representative, Dr. Luis Escobedo. The group then caravanned to El Paso for the next event. The final event was held across the border in Juarez.

It was a festive day, with a powerful message about the importance of high immunization coverage, a renewed commitment by the border entities to children's health through immunizations, and excellent media coverage.

Got Shots? Protect Tots!

NMIC, NM Primary Care Association and NMDOH coordinated the third of our Got Shots? Protect Tots! weeklong events. We had 39 providers across the state open their doors to any child needing immunizations, regardless of ability to pay and without an appointment. Roughly half the providers have reported their numbers indicating we reached about 400 children and gave over 800 shots.

Dia del Niño Health Fair

The NMIC helped to coordinate an immunization clinic at the National Hispanic Cultural Center Dia del Niño Health Fair. Together with Department of Health, UNM, First Choice and the Blue Cross-Blue Shield Van, NMIC helped organize a team of almost 40 volunteers to check shot records, look up children in NMSIIS, provide immunizations, and give incentives to children. Over 90 children got 275 shots during the Saturday event.

The immunization clinic was part of the larger health fair that provided opportunities for health services, screenings, entertainment, and fun activities for the children.
