Vision 2020 Update - Website has gone live and please RSVP

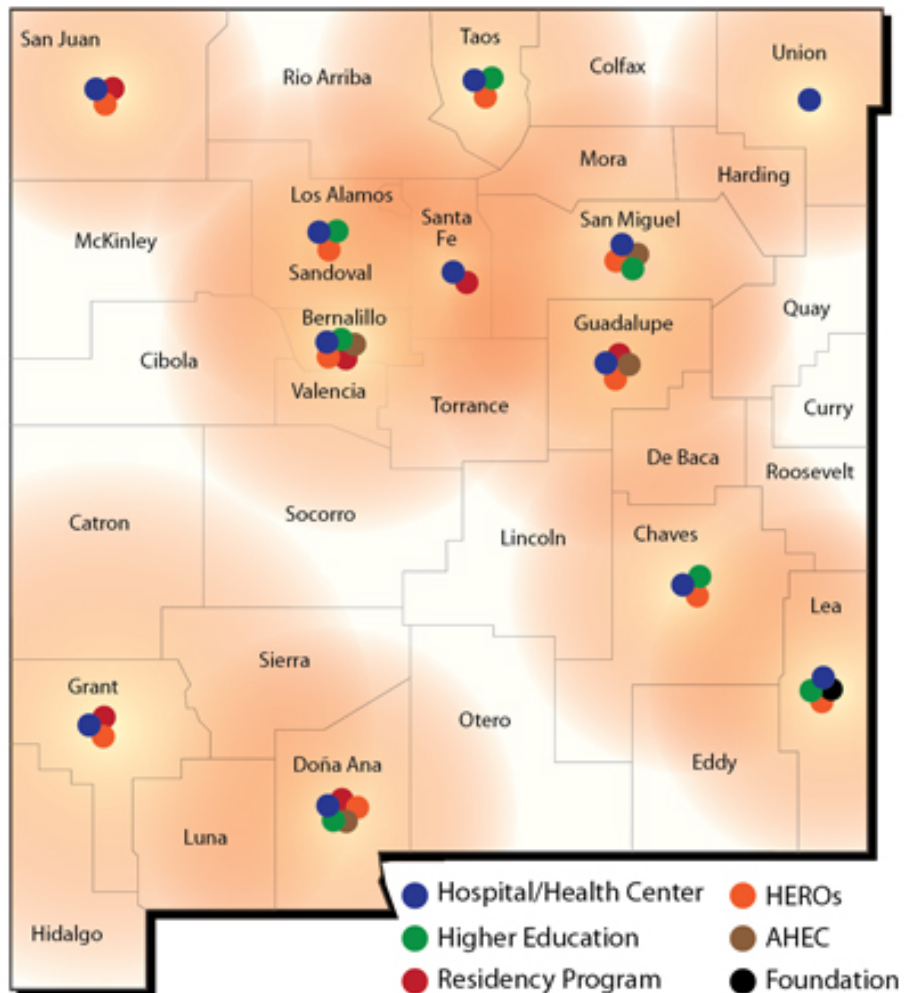
