Parent Home Training (PHT)

For Families of Children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
through 5 years



What is PHT?

- A short-term educational program for caregivers
- Free 1-1 partnership with skilled professionals
- Learn research-based strategies to support a child with ASD
- Your child is not required to attend



Who is eligible for PHT?

- Residents of New Mexico
- Child with an educational eligibility and/or a medical diagnosis of ASD
- Child that is 5 years or younger



How can PHT help my family?

Set goals to meet your family's needs:

- understanding ASD
- behavior
- communication
- mealtime
- self-help skills
- social communication



What are the benefits of PHT?

- Build knowledge about ASD and learn new skills to use at home
- Develop the strengths of the child-caregiver relationship
- Use research-based strategies in daily routines



How long is PHT?

- Up to 6 visits
- About 1 hour per visit
- Visits are through telehealth, in-person and/or phone calls



In which languages is PHT offered?

- English and Spanish
- Interpretation services are available for other languages upon request
