Population Served

Children to young adults who have intellectual and other developmental disabilities requiring high levels of care. They must be non-ambulatory and non-verbal.



Process of Selection

The child and family will need to be interviewed and evaluated for their child's suitability to the current population of the facility, as well as their level of needs is enough to be eligible. These assessments are comprehensive as they are done in home. The process of receiving services may take anywhere from 2 months up to a year.

Funding

Casa Angelica receives money from the ICF/IDD.

Casa Angelica attains additional funding from their auxiliary, Conossian Daughters of Charity who raises funds.



Casa Angelica has provided services since 1967.

How Services Are Provided

Casa Angelica provides care to 16 individuals who reside in the facility 24/7 of the time.

These services are provided by 65 employees currently. This staff consists of:

- 24-hour nursing staff
- Occupational therapists,
 - Pet therapists,
 - Aquatic therapists,
 - Art therapists,
 - Music therapists,
- Administrative staff, and others.

The facility ensures that the individuals served attain culturally competent services, including assuring their ties to their culture.

They ensure delivery of effective services and interventions through utilizing an Individual Service Plan.
