

# Dr. Kevin & Laurie Goodluck Scholarship Guidelines

A primary role of the Center for Native American Health (CNAH) is to support the academic, social, and cultural needs of **Native American students enrolled in a health-related degree program at the University of New Mexico.** Thus, CNAH offers Native American students financial assistance through the Dr. Kevin & Laurie Goodluck Scholarship.

The maximum award of this scholarship is \$300 per academic year. Recipients will only be awarded once per academic year.

All recipients are **REQUIRED** to provide at least two (2) hours of volunteer service to CNAH, (e.g., participating in or leading a CNAH presentation, assisting with CNAH sponsored activities, etc.), <u>plus</u> a thank you letter addressed to CNAH's Executive Director, Dr. Tassy Parker.

\*Scholarships will be awarded based on the availability of funds and at CNAH's discretion. This award will impact a student's financial aid. All requests and awards are subject to review for compliance with UNM Policies. Please check with the UNM Financial Aid office to clarify impact to student account.

## **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

A student must meet all of the following criteria:

- 1. Member of a federally recognized Tribe, Pueblo, or Nation must provide proof
- 2. Current enrollment in a UNM health-related degree program must provide unofficial transcript to prove current student status
- 3. In good academic standing must provide unofficial transcript that shows current cumulative grade point average

## **APPLICATION PROCESS**

- 1. Complete & Submit the Scholarship Application Form by deadline (see below):
  - a. Summer no later than June 30
  - b. Fall no later than October 15
  - c. Spring no later than April 15
- 2. **Email** the following to LoriGarcia@salud.unm.edu:
  - a. Proof of membership/citizenship in a federally recognized Tribe, Pueblo, or Nation
    - i. CIB, Tribal ID card, etc.
  - b. Most recent unofficial transcript
    - i. Transcript must show current courses and cumulative Grade Point Average

If awarded, student will be notified via email with instructions for accessing their award.

- Any student who receives an award <u>will be required to provide service to CNAH</u> by participating in CNAH events and activities
  - 1. A minimum of two (2) volunteer service hours will be required; contact LoriGarcia@salud.unm.edu to arrange service
  - 2. Volunteer service must be completed before submission of a new request, or before the end of the academic year of the award, whichever comes first
- Any student receiving an award <u>must provide a thank you letter addressed to the</u>
  <u>CNAH Executive Director, Dr. Tassy Parker</u>, with the results or outcomes of the impact of the scholarship
  - 1. Email to: LoriGarcia@salud.unm.edu
  - 2. CNAH reserves the right to share the letter with donors and the scholarship namesake

Failure to comply with requirements of the Goodluck scholarship application and/or guidelines may result in a denial and/or prevent a subsequent request.

CNAH can only provide direct payment to the student's account – **THIS WILL IMPACT A STUDENT'S FINANCIAL AID!** Please check with UNM Financial Aid office to clarify the impact.
