

Local anesthesia for the practicing dental hygienist is a 5 day local anesthesia course that will prepare the practicing dental hygienist to take the WREB Local Anesthesia Examination or equivalent examination.

A video link, course packet and textbook will be sent to the attendee three weeks prior to the course for content information.

There will be two days of clinical practice during the February dates and one day that the attendee can schedule closer to a clinical board examination.

This five day course incudes all the information that is taught in the UNM semester-long local anesthesia course (no course information or requirements are excluded). Course content includes the following: neurophysiology, neuroanatomy, medical history review, pharmacology, local and systemic complications, armamentarium and injection techniques.
