

FEBRUARY 20-21, 2020

Shilpa Reddy, MD, FAAD

Alumni Spotlight:

Interview with Dr. Bruce Fuller

Bruce Fuller, M.D. completed his Dermatology residency at UNM in 1992. Until 2017, he had spent 20 years working in Newport News, VA at a private practice he built from the ground up. He grew up just south of where he lives now, during a time when desegregation laws were still being met with resistance. Living in a predominantly white neighborhood, Dr. Fuller attended a high school where African Americans accounted for a mere 1.5% of the total population. After graduating high school, Dr. Fuller acquired a BS in chemistry at Norfolk State University where he enrolled in ROTC. He then continued on the path ROTC led him in and joined the Army, with the end goal of eventually applying to medical school. In 1981, Dr. Fuller left the Army, took the MCAT and received his acceptance letter to Eastern Virginia Medical School. In medical school, he rotated in dermatology at the VA Medical Center with their chief of dermatology. This mentorship ultimately solidified his desire to become a dermatologist.

Upon graduating from medical school, Dr. Fuller accepted a health professions scholarship program with the Navy and started an operational tour in Kaneohe, Hawaii. After 3 years in Hawaii, he received approval to apply to civilian residency programs. During his visit to UNM, Dr. Burgdorf offered him a residency slot. Having never been in the southwest before, Dr. Fuller was won over by the people, the scenery, the national parks and the fact that rent for a 3 bedroom house was only \$800 a month.

During residency, Dr. Fuller and the 4 other residents “looked out for each other” and became quite close, often getting together to grab dinner at Dr. Holguin’s husband’s restaurant (El Pinto). When asked what the program was like, Dr. Fuller answered with a chuckle. *“Dr. Burgdorf was just smarter than 98% of people. But he didn’t have too much patience, so there was quite a lot of yelling. He presented a lot of unknown slides for us to look at, and we all came out of [residency] with very strong derm-path skills.”*

Once finished with residency, Dr. Fuller said goodbye to New Mexico to finish his Navy obligation as a staff dermatologist at the naval hospital in Portsmouth, VA. After leaving the Navy in 1995, he practiced for a short time in Georgia before returning to Virginia to start his own clinic. For 20 years, he ran a well-loved and successful private practice before closing it in 2017. Dr. Fuller then worked at the Langley Air Force Base up until 2019, when he was diagnosed with gastric adenocarcinoma. For the last year, he has been undergoing treatment with great success. Now regaining his strength, he is looking forward to going back to work part-time, taking trips to Myrtle Beach, reading and riding bikes with his family. Dr. Fuller and his wife, Diane, have three children: Bruce, a pharmaceutical rep; Karanita, a pharmacist, and Brian, an analyst in the surgery department at VCU.

His words of advice to the next generation of dermatologists: *“Work hard and develop good bedside skills. Try to find a situation that’s good for you in terms of work life balance. Learn as much as you can in your residency programs. And read, read, read.”*

Academic Dermatology Positions

The UNM Department of Dermatology seeks qualified individuals for three full-time faculty positions (Pediatric Dermatology, General Dermatology, Medical Director) in an innovative group environment.
