Alumni Spotlight

Dr. Doug Johnson, MD A UNM-Trained Dermatologist Practicing in the Aloha State BY SABAH OSMANI, MSIII



Doug Johnson, M.D., is a dermatologist in Honolulu, Hawaii who has been practicing for over 40 years. He completed his undergraduate and medical education at the University of Nebraska, graduating in 1976. He then finished an internal medicine residency at the University of Hawaii, followed by a Dermatology residency at the University of New Mexico.

Meeting Dr. Edgar Benton Smith, Dr. Johnson's mentor and teacher, is what brought Dr. Johnson to the Land of Enchantment. While at UNM, he enjoyed the camaraderie he felt with his fellow residents and faculty members like Drs. Bill Willis, Bill Mason, John Haberlin, Eduardo Tschen, and Charlie Palmer. He added, "I'm very grateful for what New Mexico did for me, and the training I had there. I want to give back to the program if I can because I gained so much from it."

Currently in Honolulu, Dr. Johnson has a private practice where he treats many underserved and disadvantaged patients, including a large population of indigenous people. He considers himself a "hand" dermatologist— "I take whatever they hand me," he says. Additionally, Dr. Johnson is the Chief of Dermatology at the University of Hawaii, and he serves as the state of Hawaii's physician consultant for Hansen's Disease.

Volunteer work is Dr. Johnson's passion. He has volunteered monthly at a homeless clinic for the past 20 years and regularly offers telemedicine to some of Hawaii's rural outer islands. He has also taken numerous volunteer trips abroad; he has travelled extensively to the Philippines and Samoa to provide healthcare in resource-limited settings.

"...[volunteering my services] made me realize where I get gratification from in medicine. It made every day so enjoyable once I figured that out. I love coming to work. I realized I'm not doing it for the money, I'm doing it for my own personal gratification... we take everyone who walks in the door, whether they can pay for it or not, and it's a great feeling."

In his free time, Dr. Johnson enjoys outdoor activities such as ocean kayaking and wilderness hiking. His personal priorities include family, along with his emotional and physical health. As a physician, he values service and helping patients get well. He added, "this includes more than just freezing off their wart, or removing a basal cell; there is also a lot of emotional support that patients need—a lot of reassurance and guidance."

Dr. Johnson's advice for future dermatologists is to consider the national shortage of medical dermatologists:

"I would encourage them to not let what they are going to get paid determine how they practice medicine. I feel like there is a lot more gratification in medical dermatology than there is in cosmetic dermatology. I'm hoping that everyone continues to practice at least some medical dermatology."
