State of the Department

To our alumni, donors, and friends:

As you are probably aware, there has been tremendous change in the UNM Department of Dermatology since our last newsletter in Fall 2015. I would like to take this opportunity to provide context and details.

For the last many years, the Department of Dermatology has been small – approximately 4 faculty, 6 residents and numerous volunteer members. However, within a span of 18 months (August 2015-February 2016), we lost two critical faculty, Drs. Barrett Zlotoff and Phillip Strange, for personal reasons and retirement, respectively. When our site was visited by the American Council for



Graduate Medical Education in Spring 2016, with only 2 permanent faculty, our accreditation as a training program was rescinded. All of our residents at the time were successfully connected with other programs and our two seniors graduated and passed their boards without issue. Dr. R. Steven Padilla, Chair for the prior 19 years, retired but remains emeritus faculty. I took on the role of Interim Chair and subsequently was named Chair in January 2017.

The past year has been challenging but incredibly rewarding as we work to rebuild and grow. With UNM Hospital and School of Medicine support, we have employed locums physicians to provide continuity for patient care and access. Dr. Therese Holguin (GME '89) joined the department as a Visiting Professor in May 2016 and converted to full-time Assistant Professor in April 2017; she is an incredible clinician and educator and her role will be essential as we move forward. We began to hire advanced practice providers/PAs and collaborated with additional faculty: Drs. Shelly Stepenaskie and Hillary Elwood (Pathology), Dr. Osman Dokmeci (Internal Medicine - Allergy & Immunology), Dr. Daniel Stulberg (Family & Community Medicine). Veterans Affairs has similarly employed long-term locums physicians and a midlevel provider to continue care to the veterans. We have continued strong pre-clinical education and clinical training of medical students, Pediatrics and Family Medicine residents and community primary care providers. We have also continued our dedication to continuing medical education in Dermatology through Grand Rounds and alumni conferences (see below).

We are currently interviewing for dermatology faculty, a Mohs surgeon/surgical director and also for two joint positions with the VA. We have had significant interest, especially over the last few months, and have strong reason to believe we will fill at least two of these positions shortly. It is our goal to achieve re-accreditation of the training program in 2018-2019, which will depend most heavily on securing an excellent faculty with dedication to our mission; this will take a minimum of nine months until a decision is made. We hope for your support in this endeavor and during this time.

I will close by saying how truly proud I am to be a part of the UNM School of Medicine Department of Dermatology, to embrace our strong history and to now have the opportunity to lead us into the next chapter. I have full confidence we will succeed as we embark on this next phase of the journey, holding our values close and our vision ahead. Therese Holguin, MD


