- Degree: must be completed by August 1 of the year you apply.
- GPA: Math & Science (all math & science courses) and last 60 credit hours GPAs must be 3.0 or greater.
- Clinical Experience: minimum 1,000 hours at time of application.
- Community Service: highly recommended (not required); does not have to be health care-related.
- Letters of Recommendation: one personal and two clinical references (preferably written by a PA/MD/DO/NP) who have known you for six months or longer and can speak to your ability to be a PA; specifically, your clinical abilities and problem solving, critical thinking and interpersonal skills.
- Outstanding Prerequisites: Applicants may apply with one outstanding prerequisite course. This course must be completed by December of application year with a grade of "B" or above. This will not be calculated in your GPAs.

## COVID-19 related exceptions:
