

The UNM School of Medicine Department of Internal Medicine is excited to announce the Center for Inclusive Health's Mobile Medical Team (aka Street Medicine Team) as an innovative, compassionate, and patient-centered care delivery model for folks experiencing homelessness or who are precariously housed in Albuquerque and Bernalillo County.

The interprofessional and interdisciplinary Mobile Medical Team "meets the patients where they are" on the street, in shelters, or in temporary housing to offer high-quality acute, chronic, and preventive medical and mental health care.

The Mobile Medical Team includes physicians, nurses, ambulatory practice professionals (physician assistants and nurse practitioners) and other clinicians who have expertise in complex patient care. Street Medicine collaborates with multiple community partners including Albuquerque Community Safety, the City of Albuquerque, Albuquerque Police Department,

and others to improve patient health, and reduce emergency room visits, inpatient hospital stays, and crisis contacts.

Educational opportunities will be available to all levels of learners from all health-profession programs at the UNM Health Science Center when the program is more established.

In the Fall of 2022, a generous donation was made to bring the Street Medicine Institute to Center for Inclusive Health to work closely with the teams



and leadership to build a solid foundation to develop best practices for patient-centered care, research, curriculum development and advocacy.

In the Summer and Fall of 2023, another generous donation was secured to purchase two vehicles that were outfitted with special equipment to assist the teams in providing direct, low barrier patient care on the street.




## **Medical Supplies and PPE**

The Street Medicine Team is in constant need of over-the-counter medications, medical supplies for wound care, testing, and treatment, and PPE to protect our providers in the field.

#### **Program Expansion**

Our goal is to build a fully staffed service line that meets people where they are and provides the care they need. We are currently working with Street Medicine International to develop the plan for this expansion. Additional funds are needed to sustainably implement the plan.



#### **Curriculum Development**

Street Medicine at the UNM School of Medicine is more than treatment for our unhoused patients, it is also an educational opportunity for students, residents, and fellows. To do it correctly, we need to build a curriculum to support our learners in this important work. This medical education opportunity will make UNM School of Medicine a draw for health profession students and medical residents.

### Vehicle Supplies and Maintenance
