Project Synopsis:	Premenstrual Syndrome (PMS) is a constellation of both emotional and physical symptoms present in the luteal phase of the menstrual cycle. Within the US, it is estimated that over two thirds of women experience PMS symptoms. Premenstrual Dysphoric Disorder (PMDD) affects a smaller subset of women and comprises more severe emotional, physical, functional impairment on the continuum of premenstrual syndromes. The cause of both PMS and PMDD remains an area of active investigation, and increased inflammation in the body has been proposed as a potential mechanism/ modulator of disease symptoms. This investigation will examine the relationship between menstrual cycle-inflammation and the mood symptoms of PMS and PMDD. We hope to learn whether inflammatory changes in the premenstrual period of the menstrual cycle affect the severity of psychiatric and physical symptoms in individuals with PMS and PMDD.
