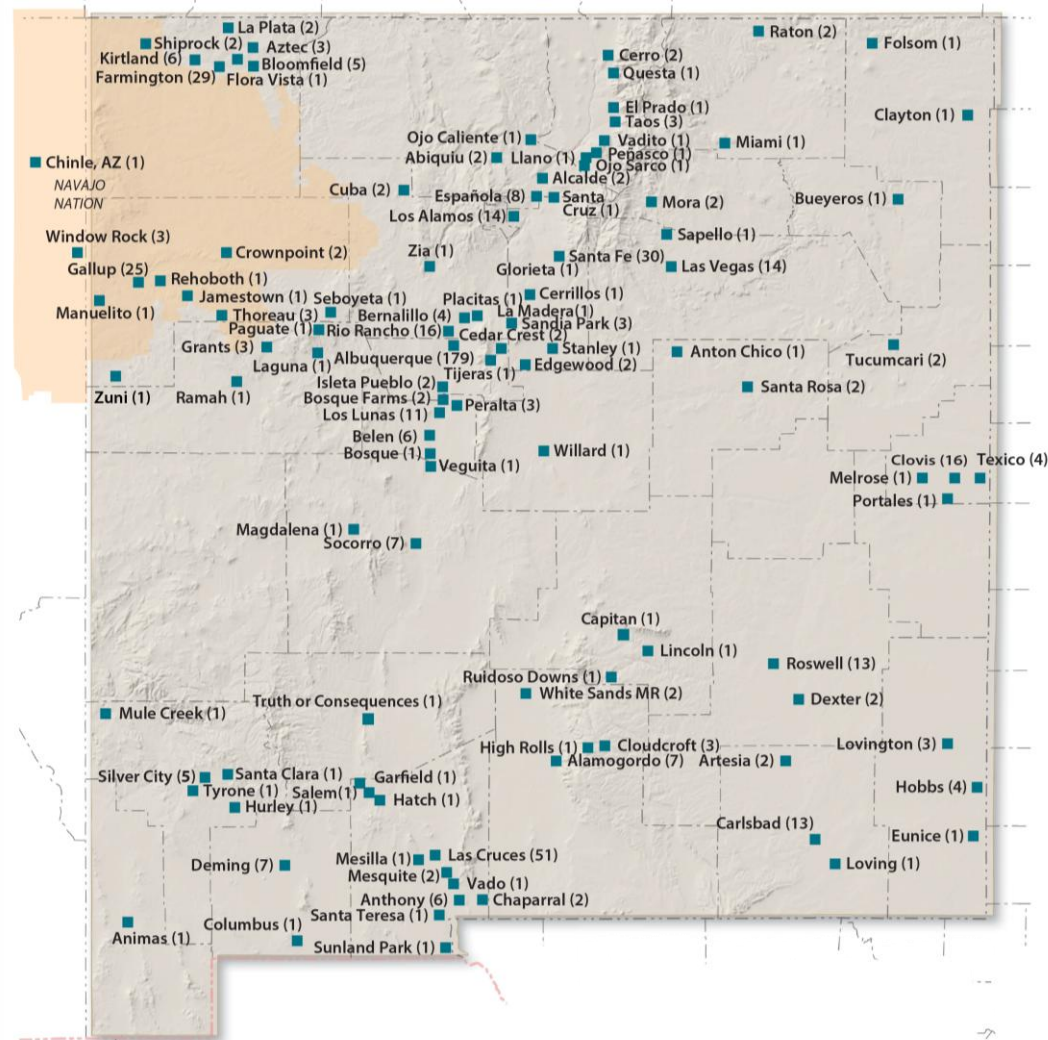

WHAT IS THE COMBINED BA/MD DEGREE PROGRAM?



- An eight-year partnership degree program between the College of Arts & Sciences and the UNM School of Medicine.
- Admits 28 high school seniors from New Mexico/Navajo Nation every year.
- Provides students with a strong foundation in a broad range of healthcare issues (including social determinants, disparities, cultural competence, and medical ethics) relevant to the specific circumstances of New Mexico and beyond.

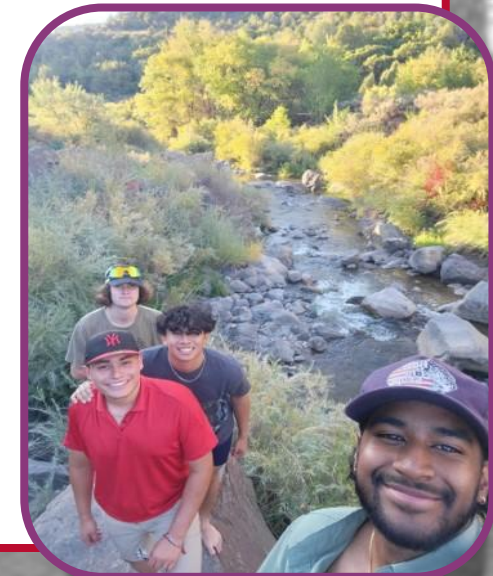

SUMMER PRACTICUM



Summer Practicum introduces the concepts of service learning, population health, and community engagement. The application and expansion of these concepts occurs through participation in clinical and community-based experiences. Practicum provides an immersive experience focused on rural medicine that provides the students with real-world examples of what it means to be a successful physician.



PATHWAY TO BECOMING A MD

- Undergraduate Degree (BA/BS) – 4 years
 - All students must stay in the undergraduate portion for 4 years
 - All students must declare a degree through the College of Arts & Sciences
- Medical Degree (MD) - 4 years
- Residency – 3-7 years
 - Students may complete their residency in any specialty they desire

BA/MD APPLICATION

- Eligibility
 - Student and parents must live in New Mexico or the Navajo Nation for at least 12 consecutive months at the time of application
 - Anticipated to graduate from a New Mexico or Navajo Nation high school during the academic year of the application.
 - Meet Minimum ACT/SAT score requirements
- All completed applications submitted before the deadline will be reviewed
- All eligible applicants will be invited to interview
- All aspects of a student's application are weighted equally

Personal Statement

In 4,000 characters or less, discuss:

- Your motivation for a career in medicine in New Mexico.
- Your background, how it is unique, and how it has influenced your goals and preparation for a medical career in New Mexico.
- Your understanding of how the mixture of various cultures affects New Mexico and how it has impacted your life.

Test Scores

ACT

- 22 Math
- 19 Science

Recommendations

- Students must select three recommenders:
 - Math/Science Instructor
 - College Prep Instructor or Counselor
 - Someone else with knowledge of your qualifications.
- An email address must be provided for each recommender.
- Recommenders will be sent a link to an electronic form that they must complete and submit prior to the application deadline.

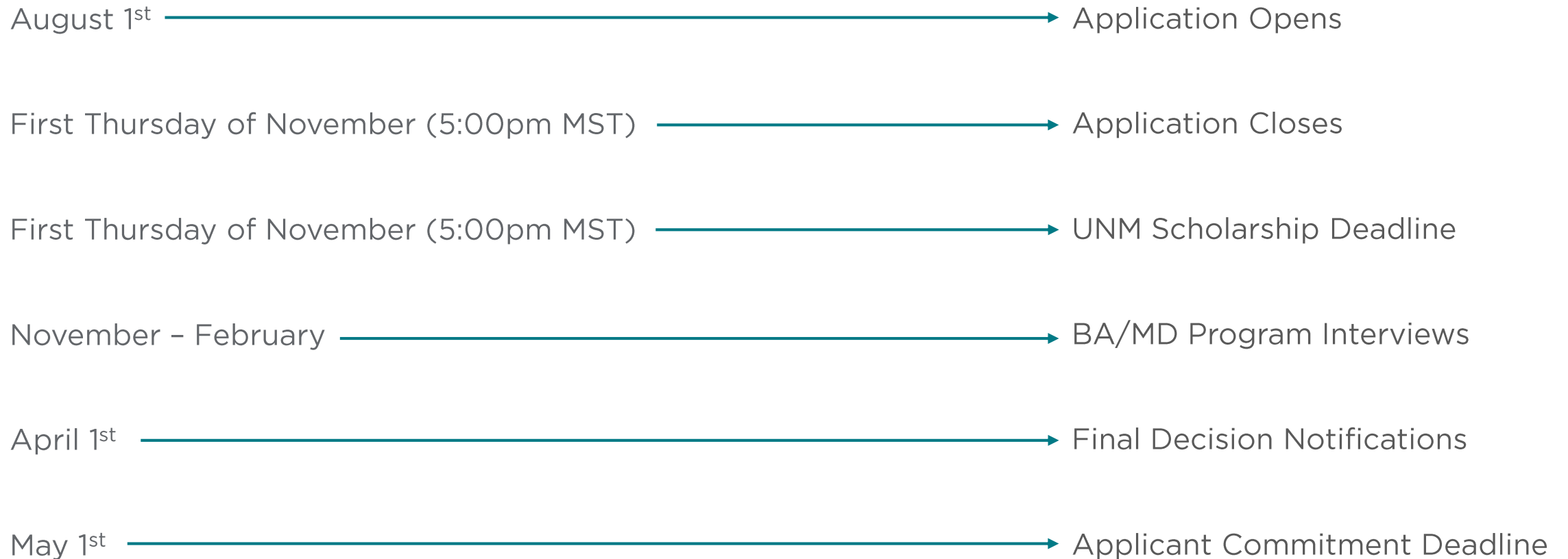
