The IHS/Tribal/Urban Basic and Refresher Colposcopy Courses are designed to prepare the new colposcopist in the evaluation and treatment of cervical dysplasia and to provide a review and update for the experienced colposcopist. The program is targeted for IHS, Tribal, and Urban Indian Clinic providers. The refresher course is ideal for gynecologists and primary care providers who do colposcopy. The format includes lectures, interactive audience response session and small group case review sessions with discussion of colposcopic images

- Review the role of high risk HPV including various genotypes in the pathophysiology of cervical cancer.
- Appropriately select areas of the cervix for biopsy.
- Appropriately use the 2019 ASCCP Risk-Based Management Consensus Guidelines for Abnormal Cervical Cancer Screening Tests and Cancer Precursors.

WHICH COURSE IS RIGHT FOR ME?

The Basic Course is intended to be a foundation on which to learn colposcopy. It is for women's health care providers who have not had previous colposcopy training.

The Refresher Course is a shorter program with less emphasis on the basics. It is an ideal review and update for OB/GYNs, family physicians, NPs, PAs, and CNMs who already practice colposcopy and want a brief review of the basics, an update on what's new with screening and management guidelines and a chance to discuss challenging cases with the expert faculty. It is also an appropriate review for those currently participating in a mentorship or preceptorship program.

THE MENTORSHIP

Learning to do colposcopy requires at least two educational components, a basic course and a period of hands-on mentorship or preceptorship. In the mentorship the fledgling colposcopist works side by side with an experienced colposcopist until a degree of competency is reached. If you are learning colposcopy for the first time, we encourage arranging the mentorship prior to taking this course.
