

## Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP) Tuition-Reciprocity

The Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP) is a tuition-reciprocity arrangement, not a financial program. PhD, DNP-Clinical and DNP NEOL nursing students apply directly to the College of Nursing for the WRGP. Accepted students who are considered residents of a Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) state (Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, Wyoming and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands) would be eligible WRGP. Under WRGP, UNM students will be considered a non-resident, but assessed a resident tuition rate. Upon notification from the College of Nursing, the UNM Health Sciences Registrar will update students' records to reflect the resident tuition rate.
