Creating A River for Your Institution of Equity-Based PCOR/CEnR/CBPR

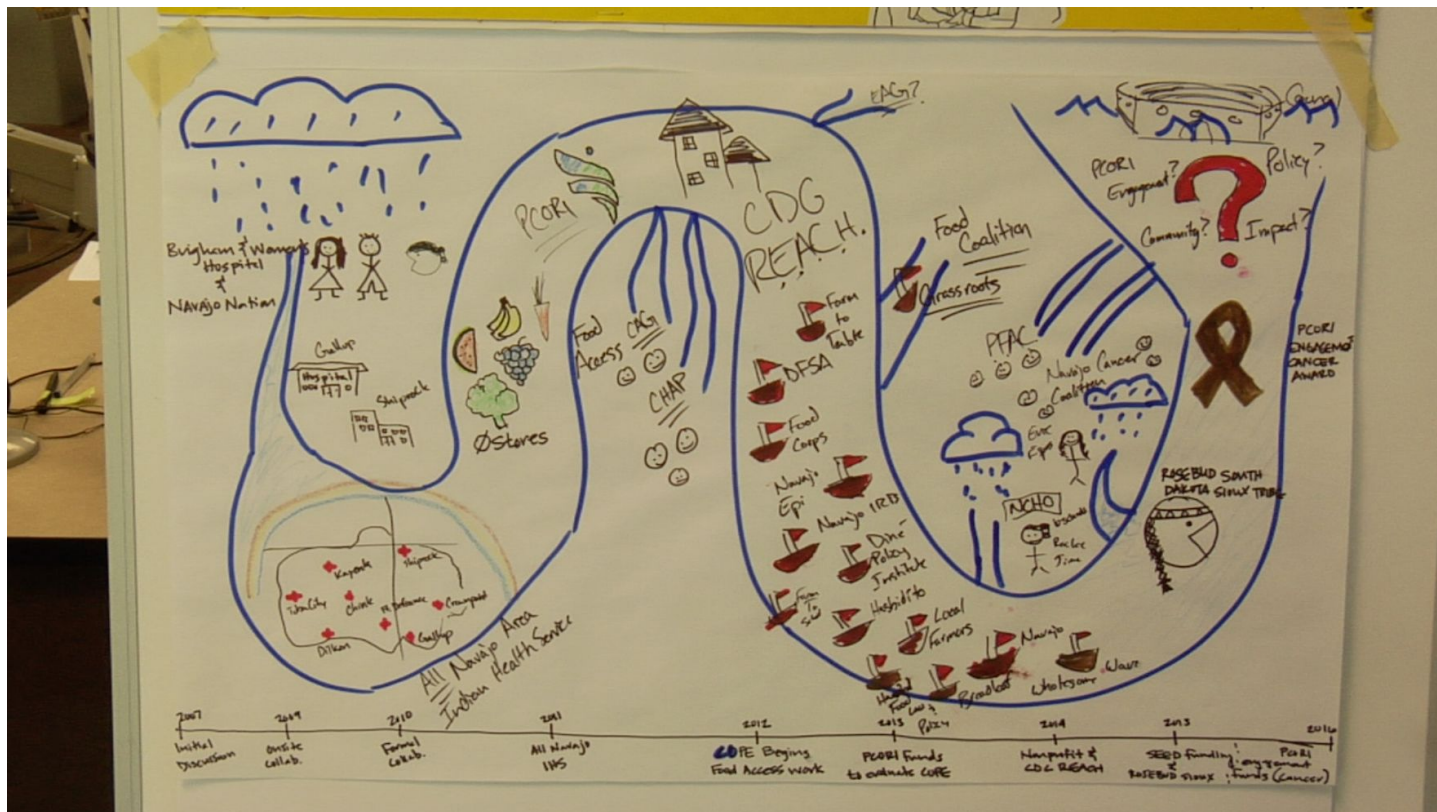
- For Each Group to Reflect on:

Creating Your Institution's River

- Start with the Beginnings
 - The headwaters or springs (values or resources)
 - What is important to know about your own history or current context and how that has influenced the process
- Follow your Journeys:
 - Could Reflect Barriers: Dams, Rapids, Waterfalls
 - Could Reflect Facilitators: Calm waters, Open Lakes
 - Could Reflect Tributaries, ie., Mentors / Leaders or other important influences
- Plan to Share with the Other Groups
