The items below must be returned to the public health office as soon as possible on the clinic day but no later than 4pm:

- Consent forms (separated into Medicaid/non-Medicaid)
- Cooler with all unused vaccine, ancillary supplies, emergency kit
- Temperature log
- If doses were wasted, make sure to document lot number & reason in the doses wasted section

## Temperature >46° F (too warm)

- · Assure that storage unit lid is tightly closed
- If unit runs on electricity, assure that the unit is plugged in and turned on
- If unit is cooled with conditioned frozen water bottles, add more frozen water bottles

## Temperature <36° F (too cold)

- Assure that thermometer probe is not in direct contact with frozen water bottles or electrical cooling vents
- Leave cooler slightly opened until temperature has returned to 36-46° F

## If temperature is still out of range after 30 minutes

- Do not discard the vaccine
- Label vaccines "Do Not Use" stored in the unit
- Keep vaccines stored in the unit
- Immediately notify the public health nurse for further instruction
- If unable to reach public health nurse, temporarily suspend your clinic until you can reach a public health nurse.

Temperature log instructions: Temperature must be monitored throughout the day and documented at least hourly. Record the time, initial, and place an "X" in the box that corresponds with the temperature.
