
The National HPV Vaccination Roundtable invites you to join the HPV Cancer Free Family group on Facebook.

JAMA Pediatrics: Communication Intervention.

A key factor influencing adolescent HPV vaccination is how a healthcare professional recommends it. An article in the March issue of JAMA Pediatrics, "Effect of a Healthcare **Professional Communication Training Intervention** on Adolescent Human Papillomavirus Vaccination: A **Cluster Randomized Clinical** Trial" found that communication has a positive impact on HPV

vaccine series initiation. Medical professionals often fail to communicate effectively about the HPV vaccine. The President's Cancer Panel has indicated that interventions to improve healthcare professionals' communication about adolescent HPV vaccination are needed.
