

Implementation of NIH Research Security Policies (NOT-OD-25-154)

Purpose

of Health

NIH is establishing a series of requirements to strengthen transparency and accountability across NIH funded projects. Compliance will be effective for applications submitted on or after **January 25, 2026**

Research Security Training Requirements: Individual Certification at the time of application: NIH is exploring system solutions to collect this certification. As an interim solution, applicants must provide a certification, and electronically signed by each individual identified as a senior/key person, as a flattened PDF in the 'Other Attachment' field of the R&R Other Project Information form of the application.

Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program Certification: Individual Certification at the time of the application: Each individual identified by the applicant as a senior/key person must certify on their Biographical Sketch Common Form, attached on the R&R Senior/Key Person Profile (Expanded) Form, that they are not a party to a malign foreign talent recruitment program.





Preview of NIH Common Forms for Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending (Other) Support (NOT-OD-25-152)

- ❖ NIH plans to launch preview versions of the NIH Common Forms within Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae (SciENcv). Users should be able to access these preview versions soon of the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending (Other) Support Common Forms and the NIH Biographical Sketch Supplement
- ❖ NIH expects to transition to the Common Forms in 2026 to provide greater standardization across federal agencies and clarity of disclosure requirements. The exact implementation date will be announced in Fall 2025
- ❖ NIH encourages the applicant community to start preparing for this change by continuing to become familiar with <u>SciENcv</u> and establishing <u>ORCID IDs</u> and <u>linking</u> them to their eRA Commons profiles

New Application Structure for NIH-Funded International Collaborations

(NOT-OD-25-155,#

Purpose

NIH has recognized that current application and award structures for subawards have failed to meet federal reporting and oversight needs. This has raised concerns for national security, especially as it pertains to tracking the expenditure of federal funds at foreign components. To address these needs, NIH announced that it will no longer be accepting new applications that request funds for foreign components using the traditional grant subaward/consortium structure.

❖ Policy

For grants requesting NIH funding for one or more foreign components, NIH will require that competing applications submit NOFO that supports the new PF5 <u>Activity Code</u> for grants, new UF5 Activity Code for cooperative agreements, or another **mechanism activity code that supports the International Project component type**.

NIH continues to support international collaborations. Of note, foreign components other than those previously supported by subawards or consortia agreements (e.g., foreign consultants, international travel) may continue to be supported through other activity codes unless otherwise indicated in the NOFO.





<u>Update: No-Cost Extension Functionality in eRA Commons</u> (NOT-OD-25-142,#

Purpose

of Health

This notice provides an update on the guidance issued in <u>NOT-OD-25-110</u>. Effective with the issuance of this Guide Notice (August 7, 2025), NIH has re-enabled the <u>No-Cost Extension functionality</u> within eRA Commons. Recipients may resume initiating first no-cost extensions in eRA Commons, in accordance with the NIH Grants Policy Statement. Requests that were previously submitted via the prior approval module will not be reviewed, and recipients will need to initiate the first no cost extension within the Status module by using the Extension action.

FUNDING PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENTS WITH SHORT TURNAROUND TIMES!

Federal funding agencies are increasingly publishing special program announcements with as little as a two-week turnaround. To help our researchers remain competitive, the HSC Sponsored Projects Office (SPO) has updated our internal deadlines for these special opportunities <u>ONLY.</u>

Create the click record as soon as possible

Upload a copy of the special program announcement to the click record

If the click record prompts you for a timeline waiver, you may upload the related memo that has gone out in the SPO Update newsletter, in its place*

> 5 BUSINESS DAY DEADLINE

- Department submits the final project to SPO for full review by the 5-business day deadline.
- Requirements:
 - o Click record created and routed to SPO
 - Sponsor platform information complete with the final proposal
 - All subawardee documentation, if applicable
- SPO will complete a full and thorough review and return comments to the department within 2 business days. This allows time for corrections before resubmitting for final review prior to the sponsor's due date.
- *A timeline waiver will be required if the final project is not ready at the 5-business day deadline. This is for tracking purposes for these special announcements.

> 3 BUSINESS DAY DEADLINE

- Department submits the final project in Click and the sponsor platform for budget and budget justification review only.
- SPO will not have sufficient time for a complete review or comprehensive feedback.
- *A timeline waiver will be required.

> ≤2 BUSINESS DAY DEADLINE

- Department submits the final project in Click and the sponsor platform for F&A rate verification only.
- SPO will not have sufficient time for a thorough review, especially during high-volume grant deadlines.
- *A timeline waiver will be required.

What Type of Research Do We Audit?





Research Compliance and Oversight Differences



Research

Research as defined by DHHS:

A systematic investigation, including research development, testing and evaluation, designed to develop or contribute to generalizable knowledge.



Not Research

The following activities are NOT considered Research as defined by DHHS:

- •Scholarly and journalistic activities (e.g., oral history, journalism, biography, literary criticism, legal research, and historical scholarship), including the collection and use of information, that focus directly on the specific individuals about whom the information is collected.
- •Public health surveillance activities conducted by a public health authority, limited to those necessary to allow a public health authority to identify, monitor, assess, or investigate potential public health signals, onsets of disease outbreaks, or conditions of public health importance.
- •Collection and analysis of information, biospecimens, or records by or for a criminal justice agency for activities authorized by law or court order solely for criminal justice or criminal investigative purposes.
- •Authorized operational activities (as determined by the relevant federal agency) in support of intelligence, homeland security, defense, or other national security missions.



Human Research

Any activity that either:

Is Research as Defined by DHHS and involves Human Subjects as Defined by DHHS; or Is Research as Defined by FDA and involves Human Subjects as Defined by FDA.

Human Subject as Defined by DHHS: A living individual about whom an investigator (whether professional or student) conducting research (1) obtains information or biospecimens through Intervention or Interaction with the individual, and uses, studies, or analyzes the information or biospecimens; or (2) (2) obtains, uses, studies, analyzes, or generates identifiable private information or identifiable biospecimens.

Human Subject as Defined by FDA: An individual who is or becomes a subject in research, either as a recipient of the test article or as a control. A subject may be either a healthy human or a patient. A human subject includes an individual on whose specimen a medical device is used.



Animal Research & Basic Science

Any research that involves the use of animals:


Animals as defined by PHS: Any live, vertebrate animal used or intended for use in research, research training, experimentation, or biological testing or for related purposes.

Basic Science Research as defined by NIH:

Systematic study directed towards greater knowledge or understanding of the fundamental aspects of phenomena and of observable facts without specific applications towards processes or products in mind.


