From Bench-to-Bedside: Ongoing Efforts to Understand & Treat Traumatic Brain Injuries in New Mexico

As recently as two decades ago, traumatic brain injury (TBI) was referred to as the “silent epidemic” by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. This moniker resulted from the large public health burden of TBI relative to low public awareness, and the fact that most patients do not exhibit “visible” signs of injury. Although much has recently changed in terms of public awareness, currently there are no clinically approved treatments for TBI and our understanding of the disorder remains in its infancy. This event will explore inter-departmental and inter-institutional research efforts on mechanisms and potential therapies for TBI that span both pre-clinical and clinical dimensions.

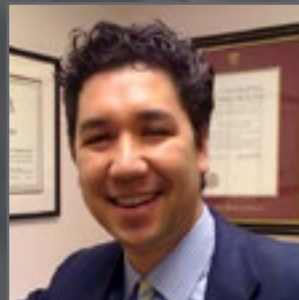
