AKT-MP STUDY PROGRESS


To date, 167 patients have agreed to participate in our study, and 141 participants have completed their first interview. Of the participants who completed their first interview, 8 participants also completed their second interview, and completed their participation in our study.

Our goal is to recruit and interview 233 more patients to become participants in our study. Study participants come from all over the state of New Mexico, and some from Arizona, to be evaluated for kidney transplant at UNMH. Your participation in this study is greatly appreciated, and we hope you enjoy reading more about kidney transplantation and transplant resources in New Mexico.





Kidney Transplant Fast Facts



- In the United States, more than 30 million adults have kidney disease.
- Of those with kidney disease, more than 600,000 people need dialysis or a kidney transplant.
- About 95% of transplanted kidneys survive the first year after transplant.
- UNMH has been doing kidney transplants for over 45 years.
- UNMH transplanted over 50 people in 2021.

Helen Nielsen, Peer Navigator

Mrs. Nielson is a native New Mexican, born and raised in Albuquerque, New Mexico. On her mother's side, many family members have suffered from Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD). Over 50% of Helen's family has been diagnosed and undergone treatment for PKD, including Helen. She was diagnosed with PKD in her late



20's. In 2015, Helen was told she was entering stage 4 of kidney failure and needed to start considering her options. She was able to get a kidney transplant in May of 2018 at UNMH. She says the care she received was amazing, and she feels better than she has felt in years. Her kidney transplant is a gift she cherishes every day. The best part of having a transplant is that she can be more active with her 4 stepchildren and 4 grandchildren. Helen was happy to be a peer navigator to others going through their own journey to get a kidney transplant. Not every scenario is the same, but at the root of the process is wanting to feel better and live a more fulfilling life. It has been a rewarding experience to speak with other patients about their stories and the path they are on to get a kidney transplant. Helen hopes her own experience can contribute to someone else's decision to keep doing all they can do to achieve the goal of getting a kidney transplant.


Pooja Singh, MD


