We are investigating different ways to provide support and help expedite the kidney transplant evaluation process at the University of New Mexico Hospital's (UNMH) Kidney Transplant Center. We appreciate your willingness to help us learn about the needs of patients being evaluated for a kidney transplant.

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Study Progress

AKT-MP Study Progress

The AKT-MP Study has been recruiting patients since January 2022 and we are so grateful to each and every participant we have interacted with during that time.

To date, 463 patients have agreed to participate in our study, and 419 participants have completed their first interview.

Of the participants who completed their first interview, 143 participants completed their second interview, and 2 participants completed a third interview.





We aim to recruit and interview 106 more patients to become participants in our study in the coming months.

This study will help us learn more about patients being evaluated for kidney transplant so we can help improve the process for future patients.

Chicken Fajitas Recipe

Cook Total 45mins 20mins 1hr 5mins

Ingredients

- 2 chicken breasts (~12 ounces)
- 6 Tablespoons grated 2% Mexican cheese blend
- ¹/₂ teaspoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/2 yellow onion, sliced and cut into strips
- 1 bell pepper, cut into strips
- 6 small corn tortillas

Step 1 Cook chicken until 165 degrees F. Let rest. Then, cut. Step 2 Cook onion until translucent and bell pepper until browned Step 3 Toss chicken and vegetables with onion, powder, garlic powder, and pepper Step 4 Add chicken and cooked vegetables to tortilla. Step 5 Top with shredded cheese. Step 6




