Greetings from the Access to Kidney Transplantation study team! As New Mexico transitions into spring, we hope you are all enjoying the blooming foliage and sun-filled days. #### **AKT-MP Study Progress**

The AKT-MP Study has been recruiting patients for just over two years and we are so grateful to each and every participant we have interacted with during that time. To date, 399 patients have agreed to participate in our study, and 355 participants have completed their first interview. Of the participants who completed their first interview, 108 participants completed their second interview, and 1 participant completed a third interview.

We aim to recruit and interview 168 more patients to become participants in our study in the coming months. This study will help us learn more about patients being evaluated for kidney transplant so we can help improve the process for future patients. 




# **Peer Navigators**

# **Kidney News**

### **New Mexico**

In 2023, the UNM kidney transplant clinic had a particularly exciting moment in the history of the program. In December 2023, it was announced that more than 50 kidney transplants have been performed each year for 3 years in a row. This accomplishment helps us move one step closer to becoming a Transplant Center of Excellence. Designation as a Center of Excellence would open up unique opportunities for clinical business, research and education programs at UNM, and the ability to create a transplant fellowship program and train more providers. All of this will help us continue to provide the

## **National**

Transplant-tolerance protocols, complex procedures that allow transplant recipients to live healthy lives without immunosuppressive medications, are becoming increasingly possible thanks to new research. The University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) now offers an Immunosuppression-Free Kidney Transplant, also known as the Tolerance Program. This program works closely with prospective kidney transplant recipients and their donors to use the donor's stem cells to prevent transplant rejection. ## **International**

Transplant tolerence procedures are becoming available around the world. An 8-year-old girl received a kidney transplant in the United Kingdom (UK) and will not need to take life-long antirejection medication as her immune system was "reprogrammed." This young girl received both a kidney and stem cell transplant from her mother.

## **Hemodialysis and Healthly Eating**

Almost 70% of adults with end-stage kidney disease are on dialysis, including hemodialysis or peritoneal. Those on hemodialysis may have some dietary restrictions, but that does not mean they can't enjoy tasty, healthy foods. See below for a hemodialysis-friendly recipe:

### **Zucchini Tortilla Bites: Courtesy of the NKF**

#### Nutritional information

- Calories 66
- Carbohydrates 9.8 g

#### Ingredients

- 2 corn tortillas, cut into triangles
- 2 tsps. vegetable oil
- 1 zucchini, peeled into ribbons/noodles
- 1 cup arugula, washed
- 1 lime, juice and zest
- 2 tablespoons fresh cilantro, chopped
- Pinch red chili pepper flakes, optional





Prep 20mins Cook 20mins Total 40mins

Step 1: Set the oven to 375 degrees Fahrenheit and place the corn tortilla triangles on a baking sheet.

Step 2: Place into the oven and cook the tortilla triangles for 8 to 10 minutes, or until they are crisp.

**Step 3:** Meanwhile, heat the vegetable oil in a skillet over medium-high heat.

**Step 4:** When ready, add the zucchini ribbons, the arugula, and the lime zest and juice. Cook until the vegetables have softened and the liquid has evaporated, about 5 to 8 minutes.

**Step 5:** Then, take the tortilla triangles out of the oven and transfer them to a serving platter. Place a tablespoon of the cooked vegetables on top. Sprinkle with cilantro and red chili pepper flakes as desired. Serve and eat.




