  - New anatomy table

- Physicians for Human Rights, Emily Sarvis and Victoria Carlson
  - Physicians for Human Rights (PHR) is a student organization that is based off of an international organization. PHR is an international organization that focuses



on fighting human rights atrocities through documenting, empowering, and advocating for patients. PHR is currently partnering with the NM immigration center and ONE HOPE clinic to perform forensic evaluation for people seeking asylum. The student organization is planning to provide training for physicians to be qualified to perform these evaluations.

- The student organization had their first educational seminar on working with immigrant and refugee populations in our state from a physician. Forensic medical evaluations document physical, psychological evidence of trauma, torture, and other atrocities. This can be submitted with other asylum paperwork in a court of law. Students will shadow a physician doing an evaluation and take detailed notes during the interview. students then write the first draft of the affidavit and send it to the physician for editing/approval.
- PHR UNM is in the process of getting official status as a clinic with UNM and expanding volunteering services to other demographics in our state.
